

WHERE TO RIDE

CALIFORNIA BAY AREA



SANTA CLARA COUNTY PARKS allows eMTBs on 91 miles of paved, multi-use and singletrack trails where bicycles are allowed.

1 GREAT RIDE The Santa Teresa County Park Full Tour is a 13.5 mile ride with 2,302' of elevation gain. The loop is a mix of doubletrack and singletrack with scenic views.

WILDER RANCH STATE PARK allows eMTBs on 67 miles of trails where mountain bikes are allowed.

2 GREAT RIDE Best of Wilder Ranch is a 16.5 mile ride with 1,593' of elevation gain. The loop is a true mountain bike experience on mostly singletrack, ranging from scenic to challenging trails.

EAST BAY REGIONAL PARKS is currently executing a pilot program to allow e-bikes on three regional paved trails. E-bikes are not allowed on any other trails.

3 GREAT RIDE The Contra Costa Canal Trail is a 13.8 mile point to point ride with 131' of elevation gain. The paved multi-use trail connects urban amenities with rural open space.

PLEASE FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES FOR RESPONSIBLE eMTB RIDING

- » On federal, state, county and local trails, eMTB access varies significantly. When in doubt, ask your local land manager about access, since local land rules change frequently. Do not ride your eMTBS in areas where the local rules are unclear.
- » Generally speaking, any natural surface trail designated for both motorized and non-motorized use is open to eMTBs.
- » It is critical that eMTB riders ride legally and only on authorized trails to show that all mountain bikers are responsible users.
